

Instructions to Authors

Ozone: Science & Engineering publishes papers on all new information on ozone, its reactions, applications, engineering and design data, and plant operations and experiences. Papers presented at the meetings, workshops, symposia and World Congresses of the International Ozone Association automatically are considered for publication in OSE. Papers will be peer reviewed prior to acceptance for publication.

Submission of Manuscripts. Three hardcopies of the manuscript and an electronic file in MS Word or WordPerfect should be submitted to either:

Each manuscript must be accompanied by a signed copyright form which can be obtained online at www.taylorandfrancis.com or by contacting the Editor-in-Chief. Completion of the copyright form is required for publication as it states that the submitted article has not been published elsewhere or simultaneously submitted for publication elsewhere. Authors are responsible for obtaining permission to reproduce copyrighted material from other sources. All accepted manuscripts, artwork, and photographs become the property of the publisher.

All parts of the manuscript should be typewritten, double-spaced, with margins of at least one inch on all sides. Number manuscript pages consecutively throughout the paper. Authors should also supply a shortened version of the title suitable for the running head, not exceeding 50 character spaces.

Abstract. Each article should be summarized in an abstract of not more than 100 words. Avoid abbreviations, diagrams, and reference to the text.

Keywords. Authors should supply at least 5 but not more than 10 keywords. Abbreviated forms of chemical compounds are not acceptable keywords.

Affiliation. On the title page, include full names of authors, academic and/or other professional affiliations, and the complete mail and e-mail addresses of the author to whom proofs and correspondence should be sent.

References. All references should be numbered consecutively at the end of every paper. In the list of references,

citations should follow guidelines of *The World List of Scientific Periodicals*:

Examples:

For journal citations:

Russel, D.H., V.J. Medina, and S.H. Snyder, "Chemistry and Biology", *J. Biol Chem.* 245(3): 6732-6738 (1970)

For book citations:

Yoffe, S.T. and A.M. Nesmayanov, *Handbook of Magnesium-Organic Compounds* (London, England: Pergamon Press, 1956), p.38.

For proceedings of conferences:

Provide Conference, date, proceedings volume and paper number where known.

In the text, references should be cited by author last name and publication year. In cases where a citation has three or more authors, use first author name and et al. (ex. Johnson, Craft, Smith 1998 should be cited as Johnson et al., 1998). If an author name format results in two or more listings, use 'a' and 'b' to differentiate (ex. Johnson, 1983a; Johnson, 1983b).

Illustrations. Illustrations submitted (line drawings, half-tones, photos, photomicrographs, etc.) should be clean originals or digital files. Digital files are recommended for highest quality reproduction and should follow these guidelines:

-300 dpi or higher

-sized to fit on journal page

-EPS, TIFF, or PSD format only

-submitted as separate files, not embedded in text files

Costs for color reproduction can be obtained from the publisher.

Tables and Figures. Tables and figures should not be embedded in the text, but should be included as separate pages or files. A short descriptive title should appear above each table with a clear legend and any footnotes suitably identified below. All units must be included. Figures should be completely labeled, taking into account necessary size reduction. Captions should be typed, double-spaced, on a separate sheet. All original figures should be clearly marked in pencil on the reverse side with the number, author's name, and top edge indicated.

Proofs. Authors will be able to electronically review their proofs before publication. All proofs must be corrected and returned to the publisher. If the proofs are not returned within the allotted time, the editor will proofread the article and it will be printed per the editor's instructions. Only corrections of factual and typographical errors are permitted.

Offprints. Each author of the article will receive a complete copy of the issue in which the article appears, up to a total of three copies per article. The corresponding author is responsible for distribution of copies to co-authors. Offprints of an individual article as well as additional issues may be ordered from Taylor & Francis by using the offprint order form included with page proofs.
